#### 1 Introduction

The European Agreement concerning the Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road, (ADR) and the Convention concerning International Carriage by Rail (COTIF) Appendix C Regulations; The International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Rail, (RID) [1, 2] <sup>1</sup> requires that:

"Each undertaking, the activities of which include the carriage, or the related packing, loading, filling or unloading, of dangerous goods by road shall appoint one or more safety advisers for the carriage of dangerous goods, responsible for helping to prevent the risks inherent in such activities with regard to persons, property and the environment."

The safety advisor is usually referred to as the Dangerous Goods Safety Advisor, (DGSA)

Clause 1.8.3.3 of ADR and RID [1, 2] states the duties of the safety adviser, and these include:

"preparing an annual report to the management of his undertaking or a local public authority, as appropriate, on the undertaking's activities in the carriage of dangerous goods. Such annual reports shall be preserved for five years and made available to the national authorities at their request."

The content of this report is not clearly defined in ADR and RID.

#### 2 Scope and Purpose

### 2.1 Scope

This publication is intended for the DGSA working in the gases industry to assist them in meeting their legal obligation in terms of their annual report.

#### 2.2 Purpose

As there is sometimes a different interpretation by local authorities on what needs to be part of the yearly report, this publication provides a template for the report.

The purpose of this publication is to give the DGSA a template to use to prepare the yearly report, so that there is an industry standard for this report in order that there is a common interpretation for local authorities.

#### 3 Definitions

#### 3.1 Monitoring

To observe an activity or process to ascertain if it is carried out according to the requirements and to alert the corresponding responsible person if a gap is detected.

### 4 EIGA template for DGSA annual report

The EIGA template is shown in Appendix A and can be downloaded as a word document and completed with the applicable information by the DGSA.
